| School Management Organisation: Communication is the key in our management principle. Different advisory groups and consultative committees are formed for effective communication of opinions. The whole school collaborates closely together, under the atmosphere of mutual trust, respect and open-mindedness, to provide quality education for our students. |
| Incorporated Management Committee / School Management Committee / Management Committee: The Incorporated Management Committee of Tak Oi Secondary School was established on 3 August 2015. Regular meetings are held throughout the year to discuss school policies and direction of the school. |

| Learning and Teaching Plan |
| Whole-school Language Policy: The school strives to develop the bilingual and trilateral capacity of our students. Students are encouraged to take part in various forms of internal and external language-related activities. English continues to be the medium of instruction except for Chinese subjects and Ethics & Religious Education. We put effort into creating an English-rich environment so that students can use the language in their school life. |
| Learning and Teaching Strategies: The school's learning-and-teaching policy aims to enhance effectiveness in both learning and teaching with due focus on the essential elements of an effective lesson - lesson preparation, student engagement and consolidation. Teachers are enthusiastic to join seminars and courses for professional development and apply flexibly various pedagogies to suit the different needs and interests of students. The school curriculum has been under constant review to be in line with the development of society, the needs of students and the changes in education reforms. For promoting whole-person and balanced development of students, the school offers a wide range of "Other Learning Experiences" opportunities to students. Different subject departments will incorporate various reading elements into their curriculum to widen the reading scope of students. |
| School-based Curriculum: 1. Electives: 3X. Business, Accounting & Financial Studies, Biology, Chemistry, Chinese History, Economics, Geography, History, Information & Communication Technology, Physics, Technology & Living, Tourism and Hospitality Studies, Mathematics Extended Part Module 2 and Applied Learning Courses. 2. Curriculum highlights: To cope with the challenges of the 21st century and to cultivate whole-person development, the school provides some school-based elements in various subjects and other learning opportunities such as Ethics and Religious Studies, S.1 Inter-disciplinary Nature-based learning curriculum, S.1 & S.2 Student Growth Lesson, S.2 to S.4 Extended Curriculum (STEM, Languages Education and Visual Arts Education), S.1-S.3 Reading lessons, S.4 Leadership training activities and S.1-S.5 Activity lessons etc. |
| Major Renewed Emphases in the School Curriculum: 1. Learning and Reading Skills: We equip students with the different learning skills, such as verbalization of ideas, use of graphic organizers to consolidate their knowledge. Students are given a good variety of meaningful reading activities to enhance their ability to read and to learn. 2. Information Technology: We have a well facilitated campus. We have upgraded our school network and refurbished the Multi-media Learning Centre for the convenient use of teachers and students. Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) scheme is also implemented in different forms. With the availability of the e-learning platforms and various tools, students are encouraged to develop effective self-directed learning both inside and outside class time. 3. Positive Education and Values Education: A good sense of moral and civic responsibility is cultivated through class building, leadership training, and the reinforcement of good habits and values. A good degree of exposure through various learning experiences also helps heighten students' awareness and self-understanding, which enables them to better develop their potentials and become wise decision-makers. 4. Leadership Development: In order to promote students' leadership capacity and responsibility, students are to undergo meaningful learning experiences. Besides taking up responsibilities to serve their fellow schoolmates, they are given chances for inter-school interflow/exchanges and various training opportunities to enhance experience and widen exposure. |
| Life Planning Education: To enhance career and life values, our school provides a good variety of learning activities to nurture our students with the necessary skill, knowledge and values to enhance their self understanding and to stretch their potentials. With good exposure and empowerment, our students not only set goals for themselves but also are resilient as well as competent enough to face future life challenges. |

| Whole School Approach to Catering for Learner Diversity: All the teachers see closely to the learning diversity of students and strive to cater for their needs through material design, group activities as well as personal care and attention. In case of special need, a clear referral system is in place to facilitate the class teachers, the Student Growth Committee personnel and the school social workers to work together to provide help and support services. |
| Whole School Approach to Integrated Education: Our school adopts the Whole School Approach to cater for the students with special educational needs. The Student Care Team, led by Special Educational Needs Coordinator (SENCO), is responsible for the co-ordination of available resources to provide intensive support to the students. Regular meetings for planning and evaluations are held with parents and students concerned in order to raise the effectiveness of the measures taken. A comprehensive support is introduced to develop the strengths and potentials of our students with special educational needs. |
| Education Support for Non-Chinese Speaking (NCS) Students: Our school provides additional support for NCS students to facilitate their learning of Chinese: providing after-school support programmes in learning Chinese; arranging intensive Chinese learning and teaching mode(s), e.g. pull-out learning if necessary, split-class/group learning, etc.; developing school-based Chinese Language curriculum and/or adapting learning and teaching materials; and organising activities to create an inclusive learning environment in the school. |
| Measures to Provide Adaptation for Learning and Assessment: The performances of the students in their everyday learning activities and in examinations constitute their academic assessment records. In addition to test and quiz results, students are also assessed continuously through the diverse learning experiences they are engaged in, e.g. assignments, lesson preparation, class participation, project work as well as field study and visit reports. |

Our teachers are all keen professionals actively involved in different development courses, seminars, and workshops, and share what they have learnt with the team and subject panel. There is a strong presence of the culture of sharing and collaboration among teachers, which synergize and enhance the effectiveness, quality and profession of teaching.
