Learning and Teaching Plan

Learning & Teaching Strategies:

Through ATDE, creative teaching strategies, collaborative learning strategies and student-centered learning approach, to develop students' creativity, problem solving and collaboration skills.

Development of Key Tasks:

Aiming to nurture students' good reading habits and reading skills, our school provides students with English and Chinese reading lessons every week. We have a NET in the English reading lessons and parent volunteers in the key stage one reading lessons. We offer various reading schemes, story writing competitions, Chinese and English daily reading schemes, etc. Our school has implemented Subject Study, Cross-subject curriculum theme-based design and STEM programme. To enhance more interaction in learning, students are also encouraged to communicate through the school intranet. Tablet learning stimulates students' creativity. Carry out Positive Education. Moral and Civic Education promotes the attitude of loving and caring as well as encourages students to pay attention to personal hygiene. Students are imbued with their obligations towards their family, school, community as well as their nation. Enhance gifted students ability through different special group training.

Development of Generic Skills:

Students are encouraged to learn with practice. Students' generic skills, e.g. critical thinking skill, creativity and cooperative skill are nurtured through Project Learning, Inventive Days, School-based integrated education curriculum, presentation and cross border exchange programmes.

Cultivation of Positive Values and Attitudes:

The school is a place full of love. We actively promote positive education, that is, we hope that students can understand the truth. The school cooperates with school-based counseling and positive courses, and each level arranges different services and adventure activities to let students challenge themselves and grow healthily.

Student Support

Whole School Approach to Catering for Learner Diversity:

To cater for student diversity, we offer students with different modes of support, e.g. enhancing groups, remedial teaching in the subjects of English, Chinese and Maths, School-based after school support programmes, Bridging programmes for the P.1 and P.6 students and participating in in-house special projects, etc.

Whole School Approach to Integrated Education:

The Student Support Team consists of the Counsellor, the Coordinator of Special Education Needs, the School-based Educational Psychologist and the school Social Worker. The team will arrange for students to receive relevant supportive measures such as assessment, homework adjustment, test and dictation adjustment, after-school counseling, support groups, separation of learning, speech therapy, game therapy, the development of individual learning plans and classes in accordance with factors such as students' learning needs, academic performance, learning progress and teachers' suggestion.

Curriculum Tailoring and Adaptation:

To cater for student diversity in learning, we adjust the mode of teaching and the amount of homework. Under a constant mechanism, teachers and parents keep reviewing the homework policy.

Home-school Co-operation and School Ethos

Home-School Co-operation:

We believe that mutual understanding is important for establishing a school with love and harmony. PTA aims at promoting home-school co-operation, organizing academic activities and games days with family members, publishing PTA newsletters, promoting Parenting workshops and also contributes valuable feedback for the development of the school as a whole.

School Ethos:

Students are recognized by their pure and honest nature, their willingness to learn and abide by school rules. They would consider the building of a harmonious campus as their first and foremost obligation. Meaningful games and activities during recess are implemented; therefore students can further strengthen their will power and build up their confidence when they undergo different challenges. By establishing more than 50 items in our extra-curriculum during school days and holidays, the school enriches the learning of students; through various outings and visits during summer vacation, students can gain lots of valuable experiences. Variety shows, performed by students, are organized and held from time to time. Future Development

School Development Plan:

- 1. The school is committed to developing school-based STEM education, optimizing computer room facilities, teaching innovative programs such as student programming, robots, 3D printing, VR and sci-fi paintings. Set up the STEM Learning Room, conduct many scientific design and activities and robot operation in order to enhance students' interest in science, cultivate their creativity, collaboration and problem-solving ability.
- 2. Add electronic interactive whiteboards in the classroom in order to strengthen the classroom interaction, student centered and enhance the effectiveness of learning and teaching.

Teacher Professional Training & Development:

Carry out professional training and development activities to enhance the teachers' professional ability on creative teaching and STEM education. Invite university professors to hold teacher training workshops in order to enhance teachers' creativity and problem solving skills. Invite educational psychologists, speech therapists and other educational experts to hold lectures in order to let teachers master positive thinking skills and cater for students' learning diversity.
