Learning & Teaching Strategies:

We have designed a broad, balanced and comprehensive curriculum with flexible use of lesson time, to provide interesting, challenging learning experience for our children. We will also use resources outside the school campus for teaching, interdisciplinary project learning and co-curricular activities will help to develop the potential of students and their creative thinking.

Development of Major Renewed Emphases of the Primary Education Curriculum:

Our School adopts an interactive and student-centered approach in our teaching. This is to arouse students' learning interests and to equip them with the generic skills, including analysis, problem-solving and communication, etc, through our curriculum.

Our School promotes the positive values, attitudes and discipline through weekly Multi-Intelligence and Moral Education lessons (M&M).

Student Support

Whole School Approach to Catering for Learner Diversity:

We believe that every student is quite different in the cognitive and affective development, interests and potential, we understand the different needs and potentials of students and try to help them learn better.

Whole School Approach to Integrated Education:

Specific measures in supporting students with SEN (e.g. teaching adaptation and assessment accommodation, remedial learning groups, training on social skills, speech therapy services, individual education plan), mechanism in soliciting parents' views and discussion on student progress.

Education Support for Non-Chinese Speaking (NCS) Students:

Our school provides additional support for NCS students to facilitate their learning of Chinese: arranging intensive Chinese learning and teaching mode(s), e.g. pull-out learning if necessary, split-class/group learning, etc; organising activities to create an inclusive learning environment in the school; and our school uses Putonghua to teach Chinese in all classes / groups at all levels with extra support as appropriate, e.g. pull-out/small-group classes, learning resources with Pinyin, etc.

Our School will formulate a school-based curriculum according to individual strengths; carry out curriculum adaptation to meet students' needs.
