School Characteristics

School Management

School's Major Concerns:

Pursue student-centred teaching and learning and develop students to conduct independent learning. Launch Life Value Education, educating students to pursue dreams, uphold correct values, make right choices and develop good character.

School Management Organisation:

To increase the transparency and accountability of the school organization, the membership of SMC comprises school managers appointed by SSB, a teacher representative, a parent representative, and an independent/community representative.

The school also sets up School Executive Committee, Strategy Steering Committee, School Development and Supervision Committees and various Action Teams to help the Principal coach, supervise, implement and evaluate the school's plans. The school sets up EC Teacher Academy to develop teachers, members of middle and senior management team.

School Green Policy:

The school building is an energy saving design. The school has made every effort to practise and educate students about the concept of 3Rs - reduce, reuse and recycle - to manage the school.

Learning and Teaching Plan

Whole-school Language Policy:

The school adopts English as the main medium of instruction; creates the language environment; and trains students to use English in the campus.

Learning and Teaching Strategies:

The school pursues professionalism in teaching: require subject committees to set clear essential learning targets; use target-oriented and psychologically appropriate teaching and learning materials; implement student-centred classroom teaching; nurture students into independent learners; assess students with diversified assessment modes and provide them with feedback; make use of stratified and progressive teaching, differentiated learning tasks as well as peer tutoring support to cope with learning diversity; and develop the capacity and habit of students to conduct self-directed learning.

School-based curriculum:

- 1. Electives: 3X. The school sets up combinations of science, arts and commercial subjects. Students are free to choose the third elective so as to fulfill the purpose of learning arts in science and learning science in arts.
- 2. Curriculum highlights: Life Value Education, Chinese Cultural Literacy, Museum-cum-Community Based Learning, Diversified Gifted Education, Multi-sensory Learning, Collaborative Learning, Differentiated Learning Tasks, Peer Tutoring, Service Program, Cross-boundary Tours

Development of the Four Key Tasks:

- 1. Help children develop proficiency in both Chinese and English so as to prepare for living in the globalized environment.
- 2. Implement Moral & Civic Education based on biblical principles and Chinese Culture Values.
- 3. Help children develop the habit of "engaging the mind to learn", "self-learning", perseverance and creativity.

Life Planning Education:

- 1. Make arrangements for students to visit different occupations.
- 2. Help students understand themselves through doing psychological questionnaires.
- 3. Make arrangements for students to visit local universities and attend talks on admission to tertiary institutions.

Student Support

Whole School Approach to Catering for Learner Diversity:

- 1. Conduct stratified and progressive teaching.
- 2. Conduct enrichment and remedial classes.
- 3. Conduct gifted education.
- 4. Implement the Peer Tutoring Support Scheme.
- 5. Design differentiated learning tasks to challenge students achieving high, average and low equally.
- 6. Implement Independent Learner Award.
- 7. Implement Core Task Learning Scheme.

Whole School Approach to Integrated Education:

The multi-disciplinary student support team formed by our educational psychologist, Special Educational Needs Coordinators (SENCO), teachers, social workers and teaching assistants is responsible for leading and mobilizing whole school's effort on the development in catering for learners' diversity. In catering for the special educational needs (SEN) of individual students, school has employed the 3-Tier intervention model which includes Tier 1: quality teaching as well as accommodation in assignment and assessment, Tier 2: pull out training programs on learning, behavioral & social adjustment etc. and Tier 3: individualized educational plan.

Education Support for Non-Chinese Speaking (NCS) Students:

Our school provides additional support for NCS students to facilitate their learning of Chinese: providing after-school support programmes in learning Chinese; arranging intensive Chinese learning and teaching mode(s), e.g. pull-out learning if necessary, split-class/group learning, etc.; and developing school-based Chinese Language curriculum and/or adapting learning and teaching materials.

Measures to provide adaptation for Learning and Assessment:

The school makes use of diversified assessment modes to assess student learning. Every year, the school conducts 2 term summative assessments mainly in form of paper-and-pencil tests. The school also conducts continuous formative assessments mainly in form of performance assessments through daily teaching, sharing of learning project learning and homework.

Fee Remission (applicable to Direct Subsidy Scheme schools only):

Our school offers full school fee remission, 3/4 ot 1/2 school fee remission. Needy students, including those from families receiving the Comprehensive Social Security Assistance (CSSA) and students receiving financial assistance provided by the Student Financial Assistance Agency (SFAA) could apply for fee remission.

Home-School Co-operation and School Ethos

Home-School Co-operation:

The school has set up PTA (a parent representative per grade), Parents' Choir, and Parent Helper Team. The school has made every effort to promote parent education on parenting and helping students grow and learn.

School Ethos

Based on Chinese cultural values and Biblical truth, the school implements Life Value Education so as to help shape children into people of conduct and values. The school teaches students to be good neighbours, good learners and servant leaders. The school presents students with diversified awards to recognize their participation, attitude and achievement. The school sets up EC Cadet to nurture students with leader potential into servant leaders. The school employs an education psychologist, a team of social workers and assistants to support students in need. The school was awarded by City University of Hong Kong the honor of Most Harmonious Campus - both the primary and secondary schools won the second runner up in the competition.

Future Development

School Development Plan:

- 1. Sustain high in academic attainment and pursue breakthrough.
- 2. Implement 12-year school-wide value-based Moral and Civic Education.
- 3. Develop the capacity of teachers to sustain the highly effective school development.

Teacher Professional Training and Development:

The school establishes EC Teacher Academy and collaborates with consultants from universities to provide training for teachers and middle management teams.

Life-wide Learning (including Five Essential Learning Experiences to be provided through Key Learning Areas, extra-curricular activities, co-curricular activities, etc.)

The school sets up various school teams, clubs and societies, school-based uniform groups and service teams. The school also make arrangement for students to attempt well-selected extra curricular activities to widen their scope and exposure.
