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S.1 Admission, Orientation Activities & Healthy School Life

Secondary One Admission
Our school will accept discretionary places. Our school will participate in the Secondary School Places Allocation System through central allocation stage (Applicable for admission to S.1 in September 2023). Admission criteria: - Academic results (Academic results at school and Discretionary Places rank order list): 50% - Interview (Appearance, Conduct, Emotional Quotient, Communication Ability, Language Ability, Creativity and Leadership): 20% - Conduct as stated in the school record: 20% - Extra-curricular activities (performance in ECA, awards and services): 10%
Orientation Activities and Healthy Life
S.1 Orientation Activities: It is our mission to provide quality whole person education which has its roots firmly grounded in Christian values. Our philosophy is "God is our Rock" and "People are the center of our care". Various orientation activities are held for our Secondary one students to develop their passion for learning and a sense of belonging to our school. Senior students are trained to be student counselors to help new students adjust to secondary school life. We believe families are integral to a student’s growing up, and the school organizes seminars for parents and various family activities to help students adapt to our school. To broaden their horizons, students also have the opportunity to join other learning experiences, such as international study tours and participate in different community services.

School Characteristics
School Management
<b>School's Major Concerns:</b> To arouse students’ curiosity in learning through an array of learning experiences, and continue to cultivate students’ character with positive values; To enhance teachers’ professional teaching and leadership abilities’ and strengthen the formation of professional learning communities; To promote parents’ learning communities and reinforces the co-operation with our community partners.
<b>School Management Organisation:</b> Our school has just established the Incorporated Management Committee in this academic year. We have set up various working groups and committees to co-ordinate cross-curricular and inter-departmental affairs such as curriculum reform, IT in education, extra-curricular activities, whole-person development and liaison with parents.
<b>Incorporated Management Committee / School Management Committee / Management Committee:</b> The School Council is comprised of members of the school sponsoring body with representatives from the Church, Diocese, alumni and independent professionals. Members are from various professional fields including ministers, university professors, solicitors, accountants, architects and principals.
<b>School Green Policy:</b> In order to establish a green campus, we have adopted energy-saving measures using extra resources. We have striven to establish environmentally friendly facilities such as special eco-insulation coating for the rooftop, installing a food waste machine and a solar lighting system. This year our students will participate in a study tour to understand the implementation of environmental education in other countries.
Learning and Teaching Plan
<b>Whole-school Language Policy:</b> Our school stresses importance of the language ability of students and puts a lot of resources in the development of their biliterate and trilingual talents. Our policy is to help students to become strong in English and excel in Chinese. Building on the strength of our students' excellent performance in extensive reading, Chinese Language and Chinese Literature, we have developed a school based Chinese Literature course in our junior form curriculum. This helps to enrich our junior form students' knowledge of Chinese literature, arouse their interest in learning Chinese and raise their Chinese standard. As for English learning, in addition to the Native English Teacher, we have two more NETs from Chatteris and a part time NET. In total, there are four NETs in our school helping organize English activities. Large scale whole school English activities are provided for students in each week and junior form students enjoy two English drama lessons per week this year.
<b>Learning and Teaching Strategies:</b> It is our mission to provide quality whole person education which has its roots firmly grounded in Christian values. Through multifarious class building activities, we foster positive values to help students’ in their personal, spiritual and social development. We focus on helping them develop a sense of responsibility and a serving spirit. Our school encourages students to learn through reading, which in turn strengthens their language foundation. We have a gifted education program which helps our best students to develop their potential, and set up after-school tutorial lessons to improve the academic performance of weaker students.
<b>School-based curriculum:</b> 1. Electives: 2X and 3X. Subjects included: Business, Accounting & Financial Studies, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Chinese History, Visual Arts, Tourism & Hospitality Studies, Information & Communication Technology, Economics, Geography, Ethics and Religious Studies. Some of these subjects adopt English as medium of instruction by groups. Applied Learning courses are offered. 2. Curriculum highlights: A Life and Society curriculum is provided for junior forms. For S.3 students, they are exposed to Chinese literature selected by our own teachers so as to develop their interest and language ability. Students’ critical thinking skills and Chinese communication skills are trained to cater for the requirements of Chinese and Citizenship & Social Development in the NSS curriculum.
<b>Development of the Four Key Tasks:</b> Learning and Teaching: We put great emphasis on the design of quality lessons to enhance students’ motivation to learn. Through interactive activities and self-regulated learning, students’ participation in class and interest in learning are heightened. We adopt OECD Learning compass and train students to charter their own learning path. Students' Development: To review and refine the arrangements of co-curricular activities so as to cater for students' changing needs by providing them with a balanced, holistic education. To encourage students to learn and understand the meaning of life through active participation in organized service activities. It is hoped that our students would learn the value of "To Serve and Not to be Served" through such community engagement. A positive relationship amongst students, their families and our school is built up through all these learning opportunities. Staff Professional Development: The school invests on systematic and organized staff professional development that equips teachers with the necessary skills and knowhow that caters for school development. To ensure the sustainable development of our staff, succession preparation and plans are drawn up. Teachers are encouraged to engage in more professional exchanges with outside organizations such as serve as public examination markers, participate in professional support groups and share our best practices with our colleagues.
<b>Life Planning Education:</b> We aim to better prepare our students in making informed and responsible choices in their life and planning by experiencing a variety of career-related learning activities. Our school helps junior form students to set goals at an early stage and help them revisit and revise their goals in more concrete ways in senior forms. Each form enjoys the provision of a career guidance counselling teacher who is willing to provide individualized service to students who need help. Whole school and school based career counselling activities are held throughout the year to help students reflect and plan for their future. Talks, seminars, visits are arranged. Students have the chance to visit universities and working organizations to enhance their exposure and widen their horizons. Our school also supports students who are interested in studying the Applied Learning courses. Information on academic and career plans is disseminated through newsletters, course pamphlets, emails and social media.
Student Support
<b>Whole School Approach to Catering for Learner Diversity:</b> To cater for learner diversity, our school fulfills the EDB requirement and have 21 teachers received training on catering for students with special educational needs (SEN). Together with the extra support of special guidance staff, art therapist, educational psychologist, speech therapist and social worker, we provide full support to students in need. The Guidance Department, SEN Support Department, the School Affairs Department and different academic panels work together to provide ample learning support and assist students in their personal growth. Counselling services, after-school homework guidance classes and special examination arrangements are also provided for students in need.
<b>Whole School Approach to Integrated Education:</b> In order to foster social integration and cultivate a caring culture, our school adopts a "Whole School Approach" to cater for students with special learning needs. Aiming at enhancing students' learning efficiency and facilitating their integration into the school life, we develop diversified supporting programs by utilizing different resources, for example, the Learning Support Grant and cooperation with tertiary institutions. Our Department of SEN Support consists of a SEN coordinator, an educational psychologist, an art therapist, social workers, student counsellors and teachers. The team cooperates with other departments to provide holistic student support. Our school also works with different non-governmental organisations. We support our students through curriculum adaptation, career planning programs, and various therapy and service groups.
<b>Education Support for Non-Chinese Speaking (NCS) Students:</b> Our school provides additional support for NCS students to facilitate their learning of Chinese: providing after-school support programmes in learning Chinese; and organising cultural integration activities.
<b>Measures to provide adaptation for Learning and Assessment:</b> Assessments: Differentiated learning and teaching strategies are used to cater for the needs of different students. Our school uses small group teaching, and different assessments for different groups in junior forms to help students who learn with different languages and at different pace.

Home-School Co-operation and School Ethos
<b>Home-School Co-operation:</b> The establishment of the Parent Teacher Association (PTA) is to encourage communication and cooperation between parents and the school. All the parents in our school are members of the PTA. We have held various activities such as seminars and sharing sessions. Remarkable activities such as sharing sessions by famous guest speakers (e.g. Barbara Chan, Blanche Tang), day trips, volunteering services and tea ceremony classes for parents have been organized. Parents are eager to put effort to the growth of their children under a close and positive school-parents partnership.
<b>School Ethos:</b> With the implementation of rigorous school rules and a student-centered, humanistic approach, our students are well-behaved, self-disciplined, modest and polite with a lot of praise from the community. Our school teachers are professionals who care for the students and enjoy a harmonious relationship with the students. We focus on the combination of discipline and counseling measures to help students grow healthily with a clear award and penalty system. Our school provides a disciplined, yet caring and harmonious learning environment for our students. We facilitate students’ adaptation to school life through various programs and policies, including duo-class teachers system for all classes, homework counselling tutorials, lunch in school for juniors, and a Big Brother and Sister Scheme.
Future Development
<b>School Development Plan:</b> We put emphasis on students’ learning ability and attitudes based on Christian principles and the school motto ‘Wholeness and Holiness’ , cultivating positive values and self-esteem to become good citizens in the society and creative pioneers. Our school has focused on enhancing students’ English abilities in a positive learning environment through various activities in the recent years. All our English teachers specialize in English and are subject-trained. Small-class teaching with appropriate groups is implemented in all forms with a school-based curriculum to cater for students’ needs. In addition, we provide English Bridging Courses, English camps, and comprehensive English activities to enable students learn in an authentic context, which enhance students’ English abilities and their university entrance rate tremendously.
<b>Teacher Professional Training and Development:</b> Our school gives full support to teachers to develop professionally through continuous studies and sharing and our teachers are outstanding in terms of professional achievements and attitude. Seven teachers were awarded the ‘Outstanding Student Award’ in the School Leadership course for Middle Managers organized by the Department of Education Studies, Hong Kong Baptist University for four consecutive years.
Life-wide Learning (including Five Essential Learning Experiences to be provided through Key Learning Areas, extra-curricular activities, co-curricular activities, etc.)
Our school emphasizes on the whole person development of students in moral, intellectual, physical, social, aesthetic and spiritual aspects. We have more than 40 groups, teams and organizations that offer a great variety and choices in extra-curricular activities. As a Christian school, religious activities are of integral importance. Our students also do remarkably well in sports. With the new focus on Other Learning Experience in NSS curriculum, our school has implemented a ‘Learn to Serve’ program in all forms, which allows the students to participate in different service teams and strengthen their serving spirit.
School Facilities
<b>School Facilities:</b> Our whole school has a newly installed wifi infrastructure that enables all students to enjoy online learning when needed. Our school campus is comprised of two well-equipped buildings, including a multi-media learning centre, an information technology learning center, a teaching and learning room, a computerized library, an English Corner, a student activity room, student lockers, a public address system and an intranet system. The hall and classrooms are each equipped with a projector screen, a video projector and a digital visualizer. Last year we installed interactive smart boards in all classrooms and special rooms. The enhanced I.T. infrastructure would enable students to enjoy facilities of a smart campus.
