**Remarks**

1. For Form 1 to Form 6 classes, Chinese Language is divided into Cantonese and Putonghua groups in order to cater for the needs of students.

2. For junior forms (F.1 to F.3), students can opt English as the medium of instruction for Mathematics and Computer Literacy.

3. For senior forms (F.4 to F.6), students can opt English as the medium of instruction for Mathematics, BAFS, Information and Communication Technology, Citizenship and Social Development.

S.1 Admission, Orientation Activities & Healthy School Life

Secondary One Admission
Our school will accept discretionary places. Our school will participate in the Secondary School Places Allocation System through central allocation stage (Applicable for admission to S.1 in September 2025). The admission criteria and weightings for S.1 DP of SSPA 2025: Conduct and attitude (20%); Academic performance (30%); Performance in the interview (20%); Extra-curricular activities (30%).
Orientation Activities and Healthy Life
In order to help the new Form 1 students to adapt to the secondary school curriculum and life, a free-of-charge 3-week Bridging Course is conducted during summer holidays from July to August consecutively. The programmes include Classroom English, Phonics, Putonghua Adaptation Series and other multiple-intelligent activities which are highly appreciated by the parents. Besides, various Parents' Workshops as well as an Orientation Night are organized before the new academic year. About 25% of the F.1 places are reserved for discretionary purposes. However, the performances in Conduct and Academic Achievements are the main prerequisite in the F.1 Admission Criteria. In order to have a healthy life in school, the school implements a series of schemes and programmes, such as the "Classroom and Campus Cleanliness Campaign". Emphasis is also placed upon fostering behaviour such as taking good care of public property and respecting others. The school also arranges healthy lunch for students and encourages students to lead a good and healthy life with regular exercise and healthy diet. In order to create a "Green Learning Environment", a tree planting scheme will be implemented.

<b>School's Major Concerns:</b> <div>1. Assessment empowers learning, inquire to uncover knowledge, passionately pursue truth and creativity. 2. <b>School Management Organisation:</b> <div>Both PTA and Student Association obtain opportunities to participate the affairs of School Administration. Our school has been a keen member of the International Alliance for Invitational Education (Hong Kong) and Singapore Education Ministry Learning Circle Project. Educational exchanges and visits to the United States of America, Singapore and other places are being conducted every year. All these programmes are highly supported by the teachers and parents.</div>
<b>Incorporated Management Committee / School Management Committee / Management Committee:</b> <div>The sponsoring organization of school is Chung Sing Benevolent Society. The society is a charity organization which endeavours to provide services to the general public in Hong Kong in the fields of education, medical services, elderly services and volunteer uniform groups.</div>
<b>School Green Policy:</b> <div>The school aims at creating a "Green" environment for the students. Programmes include "Green School Project" (organic farming, solar and wind power) and "Food Waste Collection Programme" (all food waste can be completely eliminated and broken down into organic compost).</div>
Learning and Teaching Plan
<b>Whole-school Language Policy:</b> <div>Mother Tongue Instruction with emphasis on Bilingual and Trilingual Training: 1. For S. 1 to S. 6, the "Chinese Language" subject offers separate classes for "Putonghua" , "Cantonese," and "Non-Chinese Adaptation Course (GCE)." 2. Our school implements a "Fine-tuning Language Instruction" arrangement where "Mathematics" and "Information and Communication Technology" are taught in separate groups of "English" and "Cantonese." In addition to a foreign teacher, our school has also employed three local and foreign English tutors, as well as qualified Chinese (Putonghua) teachers. They assist in collaborative teaching during classes and provide language enrichment courses and activities during recess or holidays. Depending on students' individual circumstances, some students with stronger English proficiency and Non-Chinese students are placed in English-medium instruction groups for Mathematics and Computer Literacy classes.</div>
<b>Learning and Teaching Strategies:</b> <div>Learning Strategies: 1. To develop students' learning skills, communication skills, and leadership skills; 2. To activate students' multiple intelligence; 3. To review students' learning process, there are 3 examinations per school year, and students' reports will be issued on Parents' Days.</div>
<b>School-based Curriculum:</b> <div>1. Electives: 2X. Business (Business, Accountants and Financial Studies), Information and Communication Technology, Chinese History, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Tourism &amp; Hospitality Studies, Technology and Living, Economics, Geography. 2. Curriculum highlights: Curriculum adaption, differentiated teaching, multi-sensory approach, multi-intelligence strategies, cooperative learning, graded worksheets and peer tutoring, etc. to cater for the diverse needs, interest and abilities of learners, Teaching &amp; Learning in Information Technology, Development of Generic Skills, Other Learning Experience and Applied Learning.</div>
<b>Major Renewed Emphases in the School Curriculum:</b> <div>Values education (incl. Moral and Civic Education &amp; Basic Law Education), Language across the curriculum (incl. reading), Project Learning, STEM education &amp; Information Technology Education.</div>
<b>Life Planning Education:</b> <div>Through career planning education, students are encouraged to develop a higher sense of self-esteem and make rational and reasonable choice of future career.</div>
Student Support
<b>Whole School Approach to Catering for Learner Diversity:</b> <div>All teaching staff are capable of helping students with different learning needs and diversity.</div>
<b>Whole School Approach to Integrated Education:</b> <div>My school is committed to building a culture of inclusiveness and supporting students with special educational needs in a "Whole School Approach" model. Through flexibility in resource allocation, we provide appropriate and diversified support services to enhance students' learning effectiveness and help them integrate into campus life. Student Support Team includes the Vice-Principal, Special Education Needs Coordinator, Prefect of Studies, Guidance Mistress, Social Worker, Educational Psychologist and Teaching Assistants. Good teacher professional development is the reason for a large number of capable and well-trained teachers to support SEN students. Learning Support Grant and Grant for Supporting Non-Chinese Speaking Students with Special Educational Needs are used to provide specific measures in supporting students with SEN including teaching adaption, assessment accommodation, remedial learning groups, individual education plan and outsource professional services (e.g. training on social skills, speech therapy services). Mechanism in soliciting parents’ views and discussion on student progress are well established. Curriculum accommodation and differentiated teaching strategies help students obtain quality teaching, additional support and intensive individual support. School emphasizes great importance to the cooperation between home and school. It establishes a regular communication mechanism to discuss and review the strategies for supporting students through different channels. Interim and year-end reviews facilitate school self-evaluation in order to give SEN students more effective and efficient supports. Also, school prepares SEN students well for further studies and better career pathways.</div>
<b>Education Support for Non-Chinese Speaking (NCS) Students:</b> <div>Our school provides additional support for NCS students to facilitate their learning of Chinese: providing after-school support programmes in learning Chinese; arranging intensive Chinese learning and teaching mode(s), e.g. pull-out learning if necessary, split-class/group learning, etc.; developing school-based Chinese Language curriculum and/or adapting learning and teaching materials; and organising activities to create an inclusive learning environment in the school. For Junior and senior forms, the media of instructions for some subjects are both Chinese and English. Our school adopts the Education Bureau’ s provision of “ Chinese Language Curriculum Second Language Learning Framework” ( “Learning Framework” ) in order to further address the concern about NCS students’ learning of “Chinese as a second language” . Senior forms NCS students have the option to choose subjects of full English–medium instruction.</div>
<b>Measures to Provide Adaptation for Learning and Assessment:</b> <div>Through classroom instruction, homework, book reports, project studies, quizzes, and examinations as criteria for assessing student learning effectiveness, in addition to paying attention to students' learning motivation, there is also a special emphasis on the integration of learning content, learning processes, and learning outcomes. Measures for both advanced and remedial support include: 1. Implementation of two plans: "School-Based Curriculum and Guidance"; 2. Strengthening program for Chinese and English languages in Secondary 1 to Secondary 3; 3. Mathematics support classes for Secondary 1 to Secondary 3; 4. Saturday enrichment courses for Mathematics and English for Secondary 1 to Secondary 3; 5. Summer tutoring programs (Chinese, English, Mathematics) for Secondary 1 to Secondary 3; 6. After-school and holiday tutoring classes for Secondary 4 to Secondary 6; 7. Mandarin training courses for Secondary 4 to Secondary 6; 8. Whole-school English enrichment courses for Secondary 1 to Secondary 6.</div>
